The signal quality if of less concern to me than the content. To me, content matters more than anything.

I've been writing on gender issues since the age of 10 years old. I wrote a column for "The Transvestian" called "Roberta's Recollections," before the publication folded. I've written for various publication by JoAnn Roberts; and, I've been writing for TG Forum for the past 6 or 7 years.

I've corresponded with Virginia Pince, who coined the term 'transgendered' since 1959. So, I'm not only knowledgeable about the community, but also know its history.

Content is important but it also has to be played within an historically accurate perspective. I didn't find that on Trans-Radio. So, it didn't hold my interest.

I'm not denouncing it. I'm not saying it can't improve. I'm only saying that in my opinion it's not quite where it needs to be to be a positive and constructive part of the gender community.

I'm sure that's not what they want to hear, but it's an honest and objective assessment.
